# VISITING OR NEW TO ST. MARK'S?

**WE WELCOME YOU TO ST. MARK'S!** Wherever you are on your faith journey, we invite you to celebrate life with us. Worship is in the round, and you are invited to sit anywhere in the Nave. Bulletin boards, rest-rooms and a water fountain are located in the hallway, and the Parish Hall is just beyond. If you have questions, please introduce yourself to the Vestry Greeter at the end of the service.

**The Honduras Cross**, above the central altar platform, symbolizes St. Mark's connection with the broader Anglican Communion and our obligations to our sisters and brothers around the world, particularly with our sister congregations in the San Marcos Cluster and Colonia Episcopal in Honduras. Eileen Blumenthal and the 2000 Mission to Honduras designed the cross, and Eileen commissioned its construction in Honduras as a gift to St. Mark's community.

## WORSHIP SERVICES AT ST. MARK'S

The **9 am** is a **Holy Eucharist** without a sermon. At 9:45 am, children go to Sunday School classes while adults remain in the Nave for coffee, announcements and Sermon Seminar.

The **9am Children's Chapel**, in the Adams Room, is a kid-friendly short service (20 minutes or so) of songs, prayers, and a confession ritual. At the Peace, the group rejoins the service in the Nave. (On the second Sunday of the month, when the 9am service is the Family Eucharist, Children's Chapel is not held.)

The **10 am Sermon Seminar**. After the sermon, anybody can feel free to comment on what or how the sermon "spoke" personally. Sermon Seminar concludes by 10:45 am and is often followed by a **Coffee Hour** in the Parish Hall.

The **11:15 am Eucharist and Sermon** is a more traditional format. It is often followed by a **Pub Lunch** at 12:30 pm in the Parish Hall, to which all visitors are invited as our guests.

The **5 pm Eucharist** is a contemplative service with a homily and meditative music held every Sunday. An informal social hour follows the service where food and beverages are shared.

In the spirit of inclusion we offer both a "teleloop" system and infrared headsets for those who are hard of hearing. To access the signal, switch your own hearing aid to the "T" position. Headsets are available by the doors from the beadles (ushers).

## CUSTOMS AND TRADITIONS

**Open Communion** is our invitation to *everyone* to gather around the altar for spiritual and communal nourishment. We believe this meal is a manifestation of God's love for each of us, regardless of our religion, beliefs or questions.

**Announcements** of church activities are often made by parishioners during the service. You can find more details in the Sunday Bulletin as well as on our website, [www.stmarks.net](http://www.stmarks.net).

**Childcare** - St. Mark's Nursery provides care for children up to 3 1/2 yrs old during the Sunday morning worship services. Caregivers are available from 8:45 -12:45 pm in the Nursery (lower level).

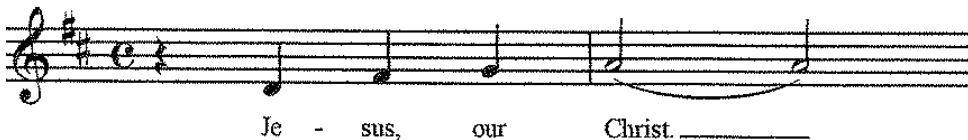

**Presider** Through the cold and dark of winter, we have heard Jesus' teachings, the many ways he calls us to live fully. As the first disciples might have done as they gathered at the table together, we remember these teachings, and the call:

**Speaker 1** Jesus calls us to be salt of the earth, light of the world.

**Speaker 2** Jesus calls us to be reconciled, one with another, and to put away anger.

**Speaker 3** Jesus calls us to love even our enemies.

**Speaker 4** Jesus calls us away from worrying and being anxious; he calls us to trust in God.

**Presider** Finally, we hear of Jesus transfigured on the mountaintop, a vision of all that he will become; and we hear once again God's affirmation: "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!"

Co-President We often find it hard to listen, hard to follow Jesus' words, and we often fall short. But just as God showed Jesus in the fullness of his potential, we share in that potential as God's beloved children.

President As we strive to live in this fullness, we remember how, on the night before he died, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat: this is my body given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

Co-President After supper he took the cup of wine; and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood, poured out for you and for everyone. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

President May these gifts of bread and wine strengthen us to answer Jesus' call. May we receive them as the very being of Christ in us, body and blood, transfiguring us for new life and freedom.

**All Amen.**

Co-President We acknowledge the mystery of our faith:

**All Who is God? Where is God? When is God? For me?**

Co-President And now, as Jesus has taught us, we pray:

**Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. ### *Bible and Religious Studies:*

12. **JESUS SEMINAR ON THE ROAD AT ST.MARK'S** - "Jesus of Nazareth: Savior, Lord, or Wisdom Teacher?" Christianity generally emphasizes Jesus as Savior or Lord, his saving death, powerful deeds, or his prophetic social program. Recent scholarship sees Jesus as a teacher of wisdom and part of a larger tradition of wisdom teaching.
